




MUTTON Monthly Market Watch



July 2023 Review


July experienced a decline in the number of seep slaughtered at export abattoirs from the June level of 9 808 to 9 347 recorded in July. Live exports also experienced a 12.70% decline from the 71 377 heads exported in June to 62 309 exported in July.

Furthermore, the all-grade carcass producer prices declined by N\$0.82/kg from the June price level of N\$53.77/kg.



99.5% of live sheep exports went to South Africa, where the remaining 0.5% were exported to Botswana, Zambia and Zimbabwe. Export Abattoirs experienced a 4.41% fall from the 9 808 slaughtered in June.

It is noted that large volumes of live sheep are still being exported to the traditional RSA market despite the increase in prices at Namibian abattoirs. This could be due to Namibian abattoirs not being keen on increasing the slaughter due to the oversupply of carcasses in the RSA Markets.

Monthly Market Watch



Australian prices have been on a decline since February due to an increase in supply of lambs within the Markets. Prices have fallen from the N\$84.40/kg received in February to the low of N\$49.98/kg in July, dropping by 40.78%. Lamb prices are further influenced by the growth of lamb imports in China, which is one of the Australia's biggest export markets for lamb meat. It is expected that the price will remain low until September, when an increase in prices is expected.

South African A2 prices, have picked up due to seasonal trends during the month of July, growing from N\$82.50/kg to N\$85/kg in July. During the winter months, lamb prices increase due to the lower supply of lambs. Similarly in Namibia, an opposing trend is seen as A2 prices have also increased by 0.71%, due to the slight decline in A2 grade lamb supplied to abattoirs.

Goat Exports grew by 16.84% from the 15 856 heads exported in June to 18 527 exported in July. 99% of exports went to South Africa for feedlot purposes and the remainder went to Zimbabwe and Botswana for farming/breeding purposes. The Number of goats auctioned sVCF dropped by 141 heads from the 8 094 marketed in June, however there has been a decline in prices across all categories.
